Assemblymember Muratsuchi Presents \$300,000 Grant to Lomita

During the 2023 State of the City event, Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi presented the City of Lomita with a \$300,000 State water grant. This grant is set to help fund part of the Narbonne Avenue Water Main Replacement and Street Rehabilitation project that spans from Pacific Coast Highway to the southern tip of Lomita, reaching the border of Rolling Hills Estates.

The project includes the replacement of a water main and rehabilitation of Narbonne Avenue's asphalt.

Lomita Residents to Begin Recycling Organic Waste in Green Bin

Starting January 1, 2024, all residents and businesses in the City of Lomita will be required to recycle their organic waste as part of California's Senate Bill 1383, aimed to reduce organic waste in landfills and address food insecurity among Californians.

The City of Lomita has teamed up with our waste hauler, Athens Services, to ensure the provision of secure and dependable curbside collection services for residents and businesses. Simply dispose of your organic waste, such as food scraps, food-soiled paper and green waste, in your green waste bin and place it at the curb on the same day as your regular trash day, along with your trash and recycling carts.
