Upcoming Holiday Schedule

- Thursday, Nov. 27, 2025 | Thanksgiving Day
Trash collection will occur Friday, November 28.
- Thursday, Dec. 25, 2025 | Christmas Day
Trash collection will occur Friday, December 26.
- Thursday, Jan. 1, 2026 | New Year's Day
Trash collection will occur Friday, January 2.

Street Sweeping Schedule

Street sweeping will not be enforced on the following City-observed holidays:

- Thursday, Nov. 27, 2025 | Thanksgiving Day
- Thursday, Dec. 25, 2025 | Christmas Day
- Thursday, Jan. 1, 2026 | New Year's Day

If your scheduled street sweeping day falls on one of these holidays, you will not be issued a street sweeping citation. All other parking regulations will still be enforced. Regular street sweeping will resume the following day.

Christmas Tree Recycling

When Christmas is over, you can easily recycle your tree! Remove all ornaments, lights and stands before placing your tree at the curb on your regular trash collection day. Flocked trees or those with decorations cannot be composted; please cut them into smaller pieces and place them in the trash bin.



Winter Water Conservation & Safety Reminder

Even in cooler months, it's important to keep conserving water and renew our commitment to safety in the event of an emergency! Winter is a great time to refresh your water saving habits and ensure your home is easy for emergency responders to find.

Smart Winter Water Use

- **Adjust your sprinklers**
Cooler temperatures and shorter days mean your yard needs less water. Water just once or twice a week, and turn off irrigation during rainy weeks.
- **Fix leaks promptly**
Even a small drip from a faucet or a running toilet can waste gallons of water every day.
- **Choose a real tree**
If you're decorating for the holidays, consider a real tree, studies show they have a lower overall water footprint than artificial ones when disposed of properly.
- **Defrost smart**
Thaw frozen foods in the refrigerator instead of under running water to save gallons each time.
- **Keep FOG out of drains**
Never pour fats, oils or grease down the sink. Let them cool, then dispose of them in the trash to prevent clogs.

Help Emergency Services Find You Fast

During the holidays, emergency calls can increase. Make sure your house numbers are clearly visible from the street, day and night. Replace faded or missing numbers and keep them clear of decorations or plants.
